Discipling the Next Generation—Genesis 18:19 Greg Stiekes, Pastor

Abraham was divinely chosen to communicate the knowledge of Jehovah to his descendants. In a similar way, Christian parents are charged with the responsibility to disciple their children after them (Eph. 6:4). In this text, the LORD Himself outlines the shape of Abraham's responsibility, encouraging us to embrace *three essential lessons* about discipling the next generation.

- Discipling is *heavenly* regarding its *purpose*.
 God has chosen parents in particular to communicate the knowledge of Him to their children by two means:
 - a. By means of *exhortation*. "Command"
 - b. By means of *example*. "After him."
- 2. Discipling is holy regarding its precepts. Nurturing children in the "way of the LORD" means that they will practice...
 - a. "Righteousness," vertically (toward God).
 - b. "Justice," horizontally (toward others).
- 3. Discipling is *humbling* regarding its *prospects*.
