BAD LIKE BALAAM from 2 PETER 2:10B-16

In chapter 2, Peter is teaching us a great deal about false teachers, and the development of that teaching continues into verses 10b-16. In verses 15-16 Peter compares them to Balaam.

The big idea in this passage is that there are some Christians who, if they don't get you abandon Christ through had teaching they get you through had living. We must not acc liv ch

cept as normal those who call themselves Christians but reject the Christian way of ring. These kinds of "Christians" are dangerous. Peter lays out three general aracteristics of dangerous Christians:	
1.	Dangerous Christians usurp authority (vv. 10b-11).
2.	Dangerous Christians revel in sensuality (vv. 12-14a).
3.	Dangerous Christians are trained in greed (14b-15).

Bold and arrogant, they do not tremble when they slander the glorious ones, where angels, while greater in might and power, do not bring a slanderous judgment against them before the Lord. But these, like irrational animals who are born creatures of instinct to be captured and destroyed, will also be destroyed in their destruction. Slandering about things of which they are ignorant (cf. 1:3, 5; 3:18), being injured as a wage for their injustice, regarding it pleasure to revel in the day, they are blots and blemishes (cf. 3:14), reveling in their deceptions while they feast together with you, having eyes full of adultery, insatiable for sin, enticing weak souls, having hearts trained in greed—accursed children! Forsaking the straight way, they have gone astray, following the way of Balaam, the son of Beor, who loved unjust wages but he had a rebuke for his own evildoing: a speechless donkey, speaking with a human voice, restrained the prophet's madness.
