The parables have taught us much about the Kingdom of which there are several aspects. Below is a brief summary of God's Kingdom.

I. THE MILLENNIAL KINGDOM

A. This will be established on the _____ (Isaiah 11:9; Jeremiah 23:5; Zechariah 14:9; Matthew 6:10).

B. It's capital will be _____ (Isaiah 2:3; 62:1-7; Zechariah 8:20-23).

C. The Jewish people will be moved out of the nations where they have been for centuries (Deuteronomy 30:3-6; Isaiah 11:11-12; Jeremiah 32:37-38; Ezekiel 37:21-25).

D. It will embrace _____ of the earth (Acts 17:22-34; Psalm 72:11, 17, Psalm 86:9; Micah 4:2; Zechariah 8:22).

E. It will last for a thousand years and will be a time of peace (Isaiah 2:4), righteousness (Isaiah 11:4), non-violence (Isaiah 11:9), prosperity (Micah 4:4) and a time when all of the physical needs of society will be met (Isaiah 35:5-6; 65:19).
