

The Word Became Flesh 3 – Hebrews 2:5-18

In Hebrews chapter 2, He who was “so much *better* than the angels” (1:4) is now “made a little *lower* than the angels” (2:9). This statement is a reference to the humanity of Christ, leaving the author of Hebrews to explain the purpose of the incarnation. Why did the Son of God have to become a human being? Chapter 2 provides us with at least four answers:

1. So that He could *die for* us (2:9).
2. So that He could *identify with* us (2:10-13).
  - a. *Purpose* of His identification—*bringing sons to glory*.
  - b. *Perfection* of His identification—*through suffering*.
  - c. *Extent* of His identification—*not ashamed to call us brethren*.

3. So that He could *deliver* us (2:14-16).
  - a. From the *prince* of death (14)
  - b. From the *power* of death (14)
  - c. From the *fear* of death (15)
