The Sufficiency of the Word

2 Timothy 3:16-17 *Greg Stiekes*

The reason the *holy Scriptures* are able to make one "wise for salvation" (2 Timothy 3:15) is that they are *sufficient* to meet every need. Paul makes this sufficiency evident by declaring *three magnificent qualities* of the Word of God:

1. The richness of its source (16a) ...breathed out by God (ESV); ...God-breathed (NIV)

- 2. The breadth of its impact (16b)
 The Scripture is *profitable* for every area of life:
 - a. It impacts what we believe (orthodoxy).
 - 1) It teaches sound doctrine: for doctrine.
 - 2) It rebukes false doctrine: for reproof.
 - b. It impacts how we behave (orthopraxy).
 - 1) It brings us back to the right path: for correction.
 - 2) It keeps us in the right path: for instruction in righteousness.
- 3. The fullness of its purpose (17)
