The Sufficiency of the Word

2 Timothy 3:16-17 *Greg Stiekes*

Is the Word of God *enough* for us? In this text, the apostle answers emphatically, "Yes!" as he declares *three magnificent qualities* of the Word of God:

- 1. The richness of its source (16a) ...breathed out by God (ESV); ...God-breathed (NIV)
- 2. The breadth of its impact (16b)
 The Scripture is *profitable* for every area of life:
 - a. It impacts what we believe (orthodoxy).
 - 1) It teaches sound doctrine: for doctrine.
 - 2) It rebukes false doctrine: for reproof.
 - b. It impacts how we behave (orthopraxy).
 - 1) It brings us back to the right path: for correction.
 - 2) It keeps us in the right path: for instruction in righteousness.
- 3. The fullness of its purpose (17)
 - a. The goal of the Word—what it intends: ...that the man of God may be complete...
 - b. The dynamic of the Word—how it works: ...[having been] thoroughly equipped...
 - c. The result of the Word—what it accomplishes: ... for every good work.
