"The Anger of God" – Exodus 4:10-17; 32:7-10 Greg Stiekes, Pastor

The anger of God, which Moses unwittingly provokes at the burning bush, becomes a recurring feature of God's relationship with His people, Israel. Unlike most human

im	ger, however, God's anger is the righteous response toward sin, teaching us what is portant to Him. It is wise for us to ask the question, "What makes God angry?" There two categories of sinful behavior which seem to move the LORD especially to anger:
1.	When God's people distrust Him (Exod 4:10-17).
	A. As manifested in their <i>stubbornness</i> .

- B. As manifested in their grumbling.
- C. As manifested in *insubordination*.
- 2. When God's people *displace* Him (Exod 32:7-10).
