## Trials in the Midst of Rejoicing Greg Stiekes, Pastor

Last week we saw that in Philippians 2:14-18, Paul urges the church not to 'grumble' but rather to 'rejoice.' In 4:6-7, however, Paul tells them how rejoicing believers respond when trials come. As we unpack this familiar text, we note that Paul gives instruction followed by a promise:

- 1. The Instruction for Those Who Rejoice *This instruction has two necessary parts:* 
  - a. Worry about nothing.
  - b. Tell God about everything. *How do we* "let our requests be made known"?
    - (1) "by prayer"
    - (2) "by supplication"
    - (3) "with thanksgiving"
- 2. The Promise for Those Who Rejoice "Peace" will "guard your hearts and minds."
  - a. The source of this peace: "of God"
  - b. The quality of this peace: "surpasses all understanding"
  - c. The Mediator of this peace: "through Christ Jesus"
