The Qualifications of Our High Priest 3 – Heb. 5:1-10 Greg Stiekes, Pastor

In order to be *in the right* before God we must have a mediator to represent us. The central argument in Hebrews is that Jesus Christ *became* the Mediator by becoming our High Priest. But what qualifies Jesus to be a Priest? The author answers this important question in our text by comparing the qualifications for the Aaronic priesthood with the qualities of Jesus Christ:

- 1. The Qualifications for the Aaronic Priesthood (5:1-4)
 - a. He must make atonement for sins (1).
 - b. He must identify with the people (2-3).
 - c. He must be appointed by God (4).
- 2. The Qualities of Jesus Christ as High Priest (5:5-10)
 - a. He was appointed by God (5-6).
 - b. He identified with humanity (7-8). We can make at least 3 observations about Jesus' learning through suffering:
 - (1) The Duration of His Learning *in the days of His flesh*
 - (2) The Process of His Learning offering up prayers and supplications...heard
 - (3) The Result of His learning *perfected*
 - c. He made atonement for sins (9-10).
