The Deity and Personhood of the Holy Spirit

Who is the Holy Spirit? Some consider the Spirit to be an impersonal influence, much like a force – the energy or power of God. God's Word clearly reveals Him as an important Divine Person. There is only one God and that this one God exists as one essence in three persons – God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, the one who takes the place of our Lord and Savior until He returns to this earth (John 14:16). This arrangement was made among the members of the Trinity. Jesus, the Second Person asked the Father, the First Person, who then gives to us the Holy Spirit, the Third Person (John 14:16, 26).
