Ezra 1:1,3	In the first year of the reign of Cyrus (538 BC)
Ezra 3:1-7	In the "seventh month," altar rebuilt in Jerusalem (537 BC)
Ezra 3:8ff	After 2 years & 2 months, foundation work begins (536 BC)
Ezra 4	Opposition begins
Ezra 4:24	Temple rebuilding stops in 536 BC
Ezra 5:1-2	In 2d year of Darius (4:24), temple work revived (520 BC)
Ezra 6:14ff	In 6 th year of Darius, temple completed (516 BC)
Haggai 1:1	In 2d year of Darius the king

 - 7.4.2. For the Lord Almighty, Zerubbabel was a sign of the surety of what he was going to do in the future and his commitment to David's line.
