THE DIVINE PATTERN OF OBEDIENCE AND BLESSING, PARTS 2B, 3 from GEN 3; 2 COR 11:3 Pastor Greg Stiekes

In the beginning, the Lord God established the pattern of our unique relationship to him. This three-part sermon explores the nature of that pattern, its violation in the fall, and its implications for our walk with the Lord as his church. The Scriptures exhort us to believe that joyful harmony between us and God—as well as one another—comes only as we yield our hearts to God's pattern of obedience.

- 4. The Reestablishment of the Pattern (2 Cor 11:2–4, 13–15)
 - a. The church is called to model obedience as a pure virgin to Christ (v. 2).
 - b. We must not be led astray again! For just as the serpent deceived Eve by his cunning, we may be led astray from a sincere and pure devotion to Christ (v. 3).
