This first of the "Egyptian Hallel" or Praise Psalms confronts us with a profound question: "Who is like the LORD our God?" (v. 5). In other words, this psalm calls

1. The People of Praise: Servants of the LORD.
2. The Object of Praise: <i>The name of the LORD</i> .
The "name" of the LORD reveals his divine qualities:
a. He exists.
b. He is a Person.

c. He is self-existent.

d. He is self-sufficient.

f. He is eternal.

g. He is immutable.

e. He is a God of grace and mercy.

3. The Timing of Praise: Forevermore!
