Matthew 5-7 records Jesus' most famous sermon, "The Sermon on the Mount." In this

- sermon, Jesus addresses a number of topics that are just as relevant today as they were in the first century. One of the topics He preaches about deals with the sin of anger. Anger is far more pervasive in our lives than we realize; we often excuse our quicktempered frustrations, angry responses and bitter hearts. Jesus' teaching reveals to us that anger cannot be excused. In Matthew 5:21-26 Jesus teaches three things concerning the sin of anger. 1. Paul's Standard Approach I. Anger is just as sinful as murder. A. The Old Testament law addresses murder B. Christ's clarification concerning the sin of anger
- II. Anger obstructs true worship.
 - A. Worship must be from a pure heart
 - B. The worshipper must seek reconciliation
- III. Anger will plague your soul.
 - A. Repent of anger quickly
 - B. God's prison of guilt should drive you to repentance
